

Trip 2017 – Total Eclipse of the Sun



Purpose: View one of the great astronomical events to be seen, a total eclipse of the sun. The eclipse will occur on August 21, 2017.




MAPS

- Corner house




Route Map (to Mitchell)



- Take I-5 S, I-405 S, I-90 E and I-82 E to US-97 S in Yakima County, United States. Take exit 37 from I-82 E/US-97 S [4 h 14 min (436 km)]
- Continue on US-97 S. Take OR-206 E/Hwy 206, OR-19 S and OR-207 S to W Main St in Mitchell [3 h 37 min (305 km)]


Note: All Camp sites are on BLM (Bureau of Land Management) land.

Burnt Ranch Rd / Bridge Creek Rd turnoff from Hwy 26 located at [44°35'51.9"N 120°12'55.4"W] (44.597735, -120.215376). The turnoff is located 5.5 km west of the intersection of Hwy 26 and Hwy 207 (Mitchell).




OPTION 1: Bridge Creek Campsite [44°36'46.6"N 120°12'37.6"W] (44.612933, -120.210445) is approximately 2 km north on Bridge Creek Rd from the Hwy 26 turnoff.

The Painted Hills turnoff is approximately 7 km further north on Bridge Creek Rd from this camp.



OPTION 2: Logging Road Campsite [44°36'22.4"N 120°11'09.3"W] (44.606228, -120.185928) is approximately 3.9 km north-east from the Hwy 26 turnoff. Take Bridge Creek Rd for 800 meters until the cross street, then turn right (east) for 3.1 km.



OPTION 3: Painted Hills NM - Red Hill Campsite [44°38'00.7"N 120°17'29.7"W] (44.633513, -120.291589) is 15.1 km from the Hwy 26 turnoff. Proceed along Bridge Creek Rd for 9 km and look for the left (west) turn onto Bear Creek Road and proceed for 6.1 km.

This is likely to be the most scenic of the camp areas. There are all sorts of fossils found here. The area was an ancient river floodplain.

This may be a popular spot during the eclipse.
